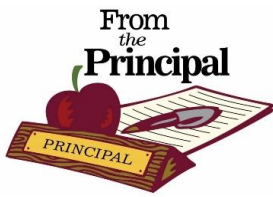

Dear Parents, Carers & Community Members,

Green Team News

Hello Cloverdale! Dan Luxton here, again communicating with far too many exclamation marks! The Green Team have been treading water during senior swimming, just quietly making 'PAPER ONLY' posters for the classroom recycling bins. Last Thursday, we put out five, almost full, 240 litre blue bins of paper suitable for recycling. Each 240 litre paper bin weighs about 50 kilograms when full. Yep, on average, the Cloverdale Primary and Ed Support Schools together produce about 50 kg of waste-paper every week - which is recycled, thus saving trees, the 'lungs' of the earth!

The EMRC do their first battery collection on Tuesday, 9 March 2021 (tomorrow!!!); the next one is in June, so please, bring in your [AA](#), [AAA](#), [AAAA](#), [button](#) and [computer batteries](#). Last year, the EMRC determined that Cloverdale PS were the most improved battery collection school (for our size). This week, during TA13's assembly, the EMRC will present Cloverdale with our rewards: a 'trophy', two cubic metres of wood chips, and a \$100 voucher which has contributed to the Cloverdale Primary and Ed Support school's membership of REmida. REmida collect materials from 70 businesses across Perth that can be directly repurposed for arts and education programs. Being a member allows Cloverdale's teachers to walk in, select materials they can imagine a use for, and at no additional cost, walk out with their arms full!

You will have noticed there are some small, yellow-topped bins scattered around the school. As promised in the last newsletter, these are for you to drop off your [Containers for Change](#). Look for the 10c logo, bring a bag of containers to school when you drop off your kids, and drop them in the bins (the containers; not your kids). Every few weeks, the Green Team will empty the yellow-topped bins into the big, red-topped bin (which is keen to talk to the students again on Wednesday during TA13s assembly).

On 25 March 2021, TA12 have been given the significant responsibility of conducting a Waste-wise waste audit. A waste audit allows students to use mathematical skills to analyse a problem and their literacy skills to drive persuasive arguments for a solution. Our principal, Louise Burke, myself, Dan Luxton, and Waste-Wise Programs Officer, Rosie Bruce will be supervising the audit. This data will be compared with audit data from a few years ago and be used to inform the 'what next' path in our recycling journey.

A champion of recycling within the Cloverdale teaching community is Ms KNUIMAN. The photo below shows an accumulation of recycled materials in the library - and that's not the half of it - there are BOXES AND BOXES of caps under the library desk ready for recycling. So please, keep on collecting your ring pulls, bread-bag tags, and clean bottle caps.

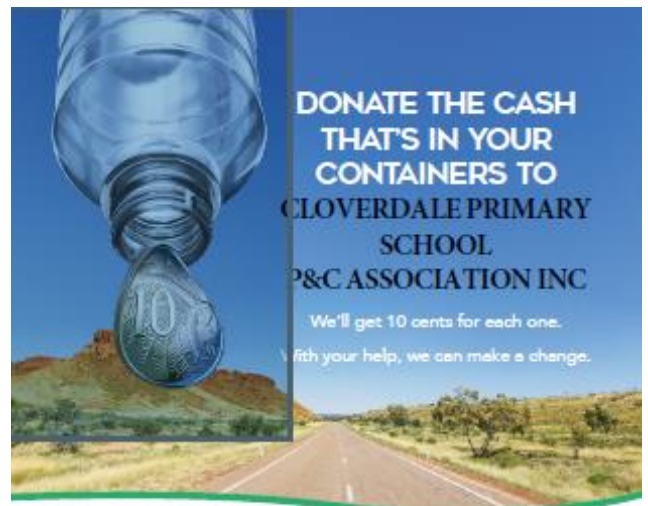

Children's new adult teeth

It can be a very exciting time when children start to lose their first baby teeth. The new adult teeth start to appear in the mouth between 5 to 7 years of age. Parents and carers can play an important role in helping their children adjust to the changes in their mouth by understanding how teeth grow.

What happens?

- The first adult molar appears at about 6 years of age, behind the last baby molar. It is an additional tooth, not a replacement for a baby tooth.
- At about the same time the lower front baby teeth may start to loosen.
- The adult teeth wear away the roots of the baby teeth until they become very loose and eventually fall out.
- Gradually all baby teeth are replaced by 12 to 14 years of age.



This may happen . . .

Adult teeth can sometimes grow behind or in front of the baby teeth creating a double row of teeth. Children can usually remove the loosened baby teeth by 'wriggling' them over a few weeks. When the baby teeth are gone the pressure from the lips, tongue and cheeks will help to bring the new teeth into correct position.

What can you do?

- Encourage your child to 'wriggle' their baby teeth once they become loose.
- Keep up regular toothbrushing even if it is uncomfortable to clean around the loose teeth.
- Maintain a healthy mouth for the new teeth.
